### A MESSAGE FROM REV. RONALD DEAN RALLIS, SR. "As the Body of Christ, Where is Our Compassion?"

Throughout His public ministry, the heart of Jesus gave Him the compassion to see, feel, and do something about the physical, emotional, and spiritual pain and suffering of others. Healing one helpless soul was just as important as those learners who followed Him in the mass crowds. As He knowingly made His way to the cross to become a living sacrifice for all the sins of humankind, Jesus still took the time to raise loved ones from the dead, heal all forms of sickness and physical disabilities, cleanse diseases, and drive out demons and other evil spirits. His compassion compelled Him to take action.

As true disciples of Christ, we have the authority given to us by Jesus Himself (Matthew 28:18-20) to preach the Good News, teach those who choose to follow the way of the Lord, and serve others in the mercy process of healing the whole person. But, let us never forget that with every command, God always gives us a promise. For us to truly see, feel, and do as Jesus commissioned His Church, we must do more than simply go to Church. *We must be the Church!* We must continuously pursue Jesus and pray for His Divine compassion to emanate in and through us from the power of the Holy Spirit who richly dwells in the heart of every believer.

*"The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much"* (James 5:16, KJV). Are we praying without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17) to have us see as Jesus sees, feel as Jesus feels, and stand at the ready to be available to the Lord? Without reservation or hesitation, are we freely giving our all for Him to use our gifts, talent, time, and treasures in demonstrating the compassion of Christ toward the lives of those around us – beginning with our Family, with one another in the Church, and within our community?

The Lord put us here – right here where we are today – for His good purpose and not our own. Let us remain faithful to follow our Great Shepherd daily, knowing we can put our complete trust in Him to care for us as we labor together to care for the whole person that is lost, afraid, and hurting. We will experience the compassion of Jesus if we chose to obey His commands as humble, submissive members of His flock. It is the compassion of Christ that compels us to action – to live a life of holiness in such a way that is pleasing to Him and has eternal value in the furtherance of His heavenly Kingdom.

Do you see the reflection of Jesus as you look into a mirror? Begin to express the compassion of Christ by fully receiving His love, grace, and mercy – the compassion He is extending to you right now. If you do, I promise you will never go back and your life will never be the same.

As the Body of Christ, where is our compassion? We can find it as we grow nearer to Jesus' heart for people in a constant state of prayer to "the Lord of the harvest" as He sends us out into the fields that are now ripe for harvesting. Just like Jesus modeled for His Church to follow, our compassion is in our action!




