If the tree quickly drops much of its fruit, is the tree bad? Should it be pruned, treated for blight, or cut down? When the fruit dropped because it was thrashed about by a storm, then no. The tree may need mending of broken branches but will bear fruit in the next season. One can assume the scattered fruit is gone from the tree never to return. That is true, unless that tree is the enduring oak. The fruit of the oak tree is the acorn. For the oak, the impossible happens, its scattered fruit is easily returned to itself by one of God's perplexing creatures, the squirrel. If God so provides that means for an oak, you needn't worry for His Church.

And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace."
